

Whether you're exploring the city centre or neighbouring suburbs, Wellington is compact and easy to navigate. Each precinct and surrounding streets offer something unique. From sought-after culinary spots to historic landmarks and interactive museums, you'll find a piece of Wellington that's exactly your kind of place.

EXPLORE WELLINGTON CENTRAL

Thorndon

Immerse yourself in history in one of New Zealand's oldest suburbs. Visit beautifully preserved historic buildings and key civic attractions like the iconic Beehive and Parliament buildings, where you can learn the stories behind both city and country.

Lambton Quay

Lambton Quay is home to high street fashion stores, Old Bank Arcade, and the iconic Wellington Cable Car. On Willis and Victoria Streets, discover Willis Lane's subterranean wonderland, local and international boutiques, and plenty of dining options.

Cuba Precinct

Cuba Street captures the spirit of Wellington – quirky, bustling, and full of creative life. Home to vintage clothing, secondhand book and record stores, quirky cafés, and the colourful Bucket Fountain. Shop for eclectic souvenirs, visit hidden bars, or soak in the vibrant atmosphere.

GETTING AROUND THE REGION

Public transport

Wellington has an extensive public transport system. Metlink.org.nz has an easy-to-use journey planner, getting you from A to B using all of the city's transport options.

Buses and trains can get you around the city, suburbs, and wider region. There is also the East by West Ferry that takes you across Wellington Harbour to Days Bay.

Car share, rental cars, and taxis

If you prefer the freedom of a vehicle, ride share services, rental cars, and taxis are available.

Car shares can be used on demand for daily or hourly hire. Mevo and Cityhop have designated parking spaces and easy-to-use apps for hiring vehicles.

Courtenay Place

A hotspot for all things fun and entertainment. Experience the magic of a live performance at Wellington's historic venues and browse world-class exhibitions at Tākina. Indulge at one of the many culinary spots or stop by foodie mecca Moore Wilson's, a must-visit for all lovers of good food and drink.

Wellington Waterfront

The waterfront is where everyone goes to hang out and relax. Explore museums and galleries, tasty food spots, and inner-city beach Oriental Bay. For iconic photo opportunities, stop by the colourful Clyde Quay boatsheds or physically become part of Wellington at the WELLINGTON sculpture.

Active transport

Electric bike and scooter share services are widely available for on-the-go use, and easily hired via mobile apps. For a longer ride, bike hire is available for half or full days from the waterfront.

Campervan parking
